

Teaching Assistant Professor of Global Supply Chain Management- 11286

Description

The John Chambers College of Business & Economics at West Virginia University (WVU) invites applications for a non-tenure track teaching assistant professor position in global supply chain management beginning August 2019.

Qualified applicants should either:

- 1) Hold a Ph.D. degree in supply chain, logistics, operations management, business administration, or a closely related discipline, by the time of employment; or
- 2) Hold a master's degree in supply chain management, logistics, operations management, business administration or a closely related discipline, and have extensive industry experience (at least five years) in supply chain management at the executive level in industry or a related organization by the time of appointment.

This position is primarily a non-tenure track teaching position, with no research component. Candidates are expected to embrace a teaching philosophy grounded in experiential learning initiatives and an integrated end-to-end perspective on supply chain management consistent with the focus of the Global Supply Chain Management program at WVU. The candidate is expected to effectively teach supply chain management courses at the undergraduate and graduate levels and work with colleagues to support and enhance our innovative and engaging program culture, and rapid growth. Service duties include supporting current faculty with developing program offerings, curriculum development and support, recruitment, student retention, student placement activities, and industry outreach.

Applications must be submitted online through the WVUHire at careers.wvu.edu and should contain a letter of interest, teaching philosophy, curriculum vita, student evaluation of teaching effectiveness, and the names and contact information of at least three references.

Review of applications will begin immediately and will continue until the position is filled.
