

## **The University of Kansas School of Business Supply Chain Management/Operations Management**

This position is scheduled to begin mid-August 2019. Required qualifications include: (1) a Ph.D. in supply chain management, operations management, or a closely related decision sciences discipline (or anticipated completion of doctorate by August 2019), (2) demonstrated evidence or potential to publish in top tier journals, (3) A clear ability to teach effectively at undergraduate, masters, and Ph.D. levels in the area of supply chain management, operations management, and related decision sciences areas. For a candidate to be considered as an associate professor or full professor, the candidate must demonstrate evidence of publishing in top tier journals and have a history of effective teaching.
