

## Project Management - Supply Chain Management (Tenure-Track)

The Black School of Business of Penn State Erie, The Behrend College is seeking qualified applicants for a tenure-track position starting August 2017 with a primary focus on Project Management with Supply Chain Management as a secondary area of interest. Qualified candidates will be considered for appointment at the rank of assistant or associate professor (Ph.D. or DBA with a primary discipline focus in Project Management, followed by Operations and Supply Chain Management is required). Ph.D or DBA in Industrial Engineering, or related fields with an emphasis on projects and with a Master's degree in business will be considered) ABDs will be considered at the instructor level). A record of relevant industry experience, online teaching experience, and ability to teach courses in project management are desirable. Both high-quality teaching and an active program of scholarship are expected. The Black School of Business is accredited by AACSB International, listed among the Best Business Schools by Princeton Review and offers 9 undergraduate majors, a part time/evening MBA program delivered at two locations, a Master of Professional Accounting (MPAcc), and an online Master of Project Management (MPM) program. The School has a focus on interdisciplinary programs such as the Interdisciplinary Business & Engineering Studies degree, one of only a few such distinctive programs in the country, the MPM program and an International Business degree which also allows students to specialize in a functional area such as business economics or finance. The Black School of Business shares a new \$30 million facility with the School of Engineering providing a basis for multi-disciplinary educational experience for students, interdisciplinary research for faculty, and joint opportunities for industry engagement. The \$20 million dollar endowment, market value of which is approximately \$33 million today, provides significant support for the School's programs. The endowment helps fund undergraduate scholarships, graduate assistantships, library and information technology resources, outreach activities, several faculty chairs and endowed professorships, as well as new programming initiatives. Teaching Responsibilities: Teaching assignments will consist of the equivalent of 15 credits for the academic year and include a combination of residential and on-line project management courses at both undergraduate and graduate levels. Additionally, there may be some expectation for teaching supply chain classes at the undergraduate level. Research Support: Includes guaranteed summer research support, full access to major statistical packages and databases, as well as funded travel to professional meetings. Salary: Negotiable and competitive with other AACSB-accredited schools of business. Location: Students and faculty enjoy the beauty of the college's 725-acre campus, located only minutes away from the heart of Pennsylvania's fourth-largest city. Metropolitan Erie is a major industrial service center with a population of approximately 280,000 and is the home of several major corporations. Erie, as well as Buffalo, Cleveland, and Pittsburgh – all within two hours by interstate highway – provide excellent consulting opportunities as well as recreational and cultural activities. Housing costs in Erie are modest. Application: Applicants must submit a letter of application, curriculum vita, three letters of recommendation combined into one document, and copies of recent student evaluations.
