Georgetown University's Robert Emmett McDonough School of Business (<https://msb.georgetown.edu>) invites applications for a Non-tenure-track Visiting faculty position, within the Operations and Information Management (OPIM) Area. Pending budget approval, the appointment would begin at the start of the Fall-semester 2016. The appointment will be for one year with possibility of extension by an additional year. For qualified candidates:

- Teaching will include a MBA course in Business Statistics and an undergraduate course in Operations Management
- Candidate will also need to offer MBA electives based on his/her expertise
- Candidates must have a Ph.D. in Business or related field.

APPLICATION PROCEDURE

All applications should be submitted electronically to: MSBOPIM-Visiting@georgetown.edu. Interested applicants should provide a cover letter, a curriculum vitae, a teaching statement, and the names and contact information for three references. The applicant's teaching statement should provide evidence of ability to teach the core MBA Business Statistics and an undergraduate course in Operations Management. Additionally, the applicant's teaching statement should describe several possible elective topics that could be offered in the MBA curriculum.

The application deadline (for submitting all application materials, including reference letters) is April 1st, 2016 or until the position is filled.
