

Tenure-Track Faculty Position in Supply Chain and Operations Management

The Department of Management at Clemson University invites qualified applicants for a tenure-track, full-time faculty position in Supply Chain and Operations Management (SC/OM) starting **August 15, 2016**. We are particularly seeking candidates with established high quality research and effective teaching for appointment at the assistant or associate professor level. An ideal candidate would demonstrate a strong commitment to publishing innovative research that will influence the field and would interact effectively with peers in enhancing the intellectual climate of the Department. An ideal candidate should have excellent communication skills, and be able to teach at a level consistent with Clemson's high standards.

Candidates seeking appointment must have an earned Ph.D or be in a situation where their doctoral degree will be completed no later than July 30, 2016. Specific interests in teaching include operations and supply chain management. Consistent with Clemson University's objective of remaining in the ranks of Top 20 public universities, qualified candidates must have a record of publishing boundary spanning research in SC/OM journals, such as *POM*, *MSOM*, *Management Science*, *JOM*, and *Decision Sciences*. We welcome candidates with rigorous training in analytical modeling and/or quantitative empirical methods (including econometric and behavioral modeling) and who are open to multidisciplinary and multi-method research. Candidates with research expertise in one of the following areas are highly desired: new product development/innovation, governmental procurement, mechanism and market design, health care design and operations, sustainability/socially responsible/humanitarian operations or supply chain contracting and risk management.

Clemson's Supply Chain and Operations Management Group has a core group of scholars with an engaging group of doctoral students. The SCM Faculty and Ph.D. students are prolific in terms of publications in top journals. The Department of Management has 34 faculty members, and offers a B.S. degree in management with six areas of emphasis, a M.S. degree in management, and a Ph.D. degree in management with emphases both in Operations/Supply Chain Management and in Information Systems.
