All faculty levels will be considered, but candidates should expect to have completed their doctoral degree by Fall 2018. We seek candidates who have an active program of research and demonstrated teaching excellence in supply chain management. Chosen candidates will be expected to conduct research, teach and perform service in this area. Salary is competitive and commensurate with rank and experience.
