The Department of Logistics and Supply Chain Management in the College of Business Administration invites nominations and applications for two positions as Assistant/Associate Professor of Logistics and Supply Chain Management. With an emphasis on academic distinction, excellent teaching, research, and student success, Georgia Southern offers both undergraduate and graduate students an attractive campus environment that encourages learning, discovery, and personal growth.

Within this setting, close to the Port of Savannah, the Department of Logistics and Supply Chain Management offers an undergraduate Bachelor of Business Administration degree program in Logistics and Intermodal Transportation. Departmental faculty members also deliver undergraduate and MBA business core classes in Operation Management, Statistics and Applied Optimization, elective courses in operations management as well as serving the Ph.D. Program in Logistics and Supply Chain Management. Faculty members are expected to contribute to the Department's goal of achieving national distinction in the discipline through academic research and program outcomes. Faculty must also be willing to interact with students through activities such as advising, mentoring, and collaborative research.

Position Description. Reporting to the Chair of the Department of Logistics and Supply Chain Management, the positions require research, teaching and service responsibilities as well as a terminal degree. The ability to contribute to a positive collegial work environment in the Department, College, and University is also expected as well as a strong orientation to recruiting, retaining, and mentoring qualified students. The positions are 9-month tenure-track appointments, beginning August 1, 2016, and the salary is competitive and commensurate with qualifications and experience.

Required Qualifications:

- PhD or DBA in logistics, supply chain management or a closely related field from an AACSB or EQUIS accredited institution by August 1, 2016
- Evidence of the ability to develop, execute and maintain a strong research agenda
- Evidence of the potential for above average teaching ability
- Evidence of effective communication skills
- Willingness to teach via web-based instruction
- Must be authorized to work in the United States for the duration of employment without assistance from the institution

For appointment at the associate professor rank, a minimum of 5 years full-time university-level teaching experience at the rank of assistant professor is required, along with a strong record of research, teaching and service, with publications and presentations in top academic and professional venues.

Preferred Qualifications:

- Capabilities to teach doctoral courses in the Ph.D. program
- Experience working with a diverse student body
- Evidence of ability to teach undergraduate courses in quantitative methods

Screening of applications begins **May 13, 2016** and will continue until the position is filled. The preferred position starting date is **August 1, 2016**. A complete application consists of a letter addressing the qualifications cited above; curriculum vitae; and the names, addresses, telephone numbers, and email addresses of at least three professional references. Other documentation may be requested. ***Only applications submitted as an email attachment in either Word or PDF format will be accepted.*** Finalists will be required to submit to a background investigation.
