

Non-Tenure Track Position in Supply Chain Management

The applicant should be able to teach undergraduate and graduate level courses in operations and supply chain management. The preferred candidate will have a Ph.D. (granted or near completion) in a relevant field and demonstrated ability to teach undergraduate and graduate business students effectively. Preference also will be given to candidates with an interest in active learning pedagogy.

To ensure full consideration, application materials must include letter of intent, curriculum vitae, and list of three references.
