We particularly welcome those with research and teaching interests that include sustainability, demand modeling and pricing, or dynamic and stochastic optimization.

We seek scholars who can support the academic undergraduate, and master's level curriculum in supply chain management and operations, and industry-focused supply chain related activities. - For the position at the Assistant level, candidates completing a Ph.D. by Fall 2024 are preferred but ABDs will be considered.
- Demonstrated teaching effectiveness and experience developing curriculum.

The diversity statement should be no more than 300 words. In the application materials, the candidate should also provide the names and email addresses of three individuals prepared to speak to their professional qualifications for this position. Referees will not be contacted immediately but might be at subsequent points in the review process.

References will not be contacted immediately, but potentially later, in the review process. In general, the committee encourages candidates to be mindful of the length of the documents in their application, particularly documents regarding their research statement and teaching philosophy.
