

## **Tenure Track faculty position in Innovation Management at the Stockholm School of Economics**

The House of Innovation (HOI) at the Stockholm School of Economics (SSE) currently invites expressions of interest for a tenure-track position (Assistant Professor level) with a focus on **Innovation Management**.

Candidates are expected to have a background in a field such as Technology and Innovation Management, Digital Innovation, or Technology Strategy. A PhD in a related field is required by the time of assuming the position.

We are a cross-disciplinary research environment, with scholars working in Technology & Innovation Management, Entrepreneurship, Information Systems, and Operations & Supply Chain Management. Stockholm is consistently ranked as a top-ten environment for tech-based entrepreneurship and innovation. HOI has its own incubator and excellent access to the entrepreneurial and innovation ecosystem as well as to many world-leading companies operating in and from Stockholm. Our students are highly talented and motivated, and our programs are highly regarded.

Candidates are expected to have strong qualities in both research and teaching. In research, the successful candidate should exhibit the ability to publish in top-tier, peer-reviewed, international journals, as evidenced by a promising research and publication pipeline, a presence in the international research community, and publications in leading journals (if available). In teaching, experience from designing and delivering courses, as well as from coaching student projects, is considered a merit. Candidates will be expected to interact and collaborate with faculty from other disciplines and to exercise intellectual leadership in their discipline.

The vacant assistant professorship is a 3+3 year tenure-track position with research and teaching obligations. Promotion to tenured associate professor is possible with satisfactory teaching and publication performance. An ideal starting date for successful applicants is August 2025, but we are open to discussing other dates. Salaries are competitive, commensurate with qualifications and experience, and are set on an individual basis.

We will conduct a first round of interviews soon after the September 15th deadline and host campus visits by invitation in the Fall of 2024.

1. A cover letter articulating the candidate's fit with the position description, including research interests and teaching experience.
2. A curriculum vitae.
3. A separate document listing both published articles (if any) and articles submitted to journals.
4. Copies of representative research.

5. Names and contact information of three people willing to provide references. To ensure that your application will receive full consideration, please submit your full application via **Varbi** by **September 15th, 2024 (CET)**.

They serve on editorial boards, in editorial positions, and in academic leadership positions. They frequently receive substantial grants from leading Swedish and European funding institutions to conduct state-of-the-art research, and serve on national and international policy committees, thus contributing to the shaping of society and of innovation ecosystems.

The benefits of becoming a faculty member at HOI include, but are not limited to:

- Enjoying a favorable balance between teaching and research activities (from 20% to 40% teaching).
- Tapping into cross-disciplinary expertise in innovation, entrepreneurship, information systems and operations/supply chain management.
- Teaching highly talented and motivated students/participants, from undergraduate to master and doctoral levels, as well as in MBA and Executive Education programs. Our master programs are ranked 19th (Management) in 2023 and 23rd (Finance) in the world by Financial Times in 2024. SSE Executive Education is ranked 17th in the world for open programs by FT. Our admissions processes are highly selective.
- Working in a young, dynamic, international, diverse environment. Recent faculty hires to SSE come from environments such as London Business School, Bocconi, Harvard U, INSEAD, New York University, HKUST, RSM among others.
- Being part of, and contributing to, the Stockholm entrepreneurial and innovation ecosystem in a wide and comprehensive way. HOI hosts the academic Department of Entrepreneurship,
