

Tenure-track Assistant Professor in Supply Chain and Operations Management

Description

The School of Management at the University at Buffalo invites applications for a full-time tenure-track Assistant Professor (10 months) position in Supply chain and Operations Management. The appointment will start Fall 2025. Candidates are expected to pursue high-quality research and have a strong commitment to the development of the Department's academic programs at undergraduate, MBA, MS, and Ph.D. levels, in terms of teaching and leadership. Candidates are expected to contribute to university-wide interdisciplinary research and support the educational mission of the UB RENEW Institute and the Institute for Sustainable Transportation & Logistics.

Qualifications

Applicants should have completed a Ph.D. degree in Operations Management, Management Science, or a related field by June 2025 and demonstrated a clear and strong potential for high-quality scholarly research that is disseminated in leading research outlets. Applicants will ideally conduct research in the domain of Supply chain and Operations Management and publish in top-tier journals. Research methods include but are not restricted to operations research, stochastic modeling, empirical methods, data analytics, and machine learning. Initial teaching duties will be introductory undergraduate and graduate operations management courses, and evidence of effective teaching experience is desirable.
