Brief Summary of Work for this Position:

The Congdon School of Supply Chain, Business Analytics and Information Systems at the University of North Carolina Wilmington, Cameron School of Business invites applications for an Assistant or Associate Professor of Practice in Cybersecurity to begin August 2025.

This is a full-time non-tenure track, contracted position. Recent industry experience is preferred. The Professor of Practice will serve either an initial one-year appointment at the rank of Assistant or an initial two-year appointment at the rank of Associate. The successful candidate is expected to teach seven sections combined in the fall and spring semesters. The Professor of Practice is expected to achieve a minimum of one publication in a journal on the CSB Quality Journal List over a rolling five-year period. Scholarship relevant to professional practice is encouraged.

Additionally, the successful candidate will contribute to service (examples include but are not limited to committee work, professional talks, and mentoring), research (examples include but are not limited to presentations at meetings and conferences and publications in field of interest), and professional impact activities (examples include but are not limited to executive education involvement, building and maintaining relationships with industry partners, alumni engagement, business consultancy that includes students) that positively enhance the school, business community, and society.

Minimum Education and Experience Requirements:

A Ph.D., DBA, or equivalent degree in Cybersecurity or a closely related field from a nationally accredited institution at the time of application.
